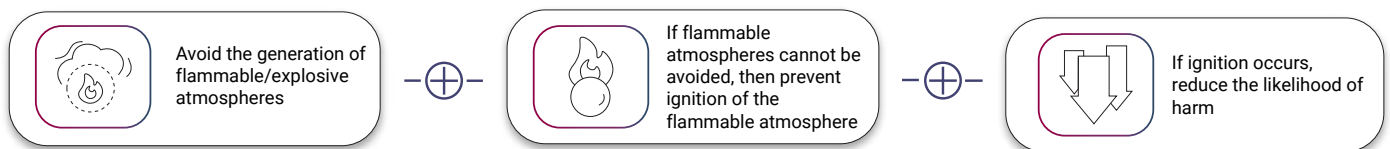


DSEAR Compliance is a Journey not a Destination

Under the Dangerous Substances and Explosion Atmosphere Regulations (DSEAR), it is the specific duty of an operator to ensure that the hazards of fire and explosion are identified, that measures are implemented to control the risks of fire and explosion, and that these measures are maintained to ensure their effectiveness.

A DSEAR assessment's control measures must be reviewed to remove risks from the presence of dangerous substances in a process, minimise the likelihood of the risk occurring as much as is practically possible, and lessen the effects of any fire or explosion that might still occur.

The best course of action is to try to eliminate risk, but where the risk cannot be removed, DSEAR mandates the application of mitigation measures.
